Friday from 7:00–8:00pm: *Nicole Wakeling* is an American singer/songwriter who moved to Devon in 2004 and has been gigging as a solo acoustic artist since 2007. Known for her soulful voice and down to earth performances, Nicole constructs her own arrangements of current and classic covers using a Boss RC-50 Loopstation to create a one woman band. From Johnny Cash to Lady Gaga, Nicole plays an array of songs.

Friday from 8:30–9:30pm: Beacon Fire is a fresh new progressive folk rock band based in Devon. After a stunning small set last year, we just had to invite them back for more! They mainly focus on original material including songs from singer songwriter/guitarist Robert Edis. They get their influences from the likes of All About Eve, Marillion, Pink Floyd, Iona, amongst others.





Friday from 10:00–12:00am: *Crow Dawn* is a rock covers band from Wellington. A real rock 'n' roll party is promised in an energetic 2-hour set playing some of the best rock music from the 60s to the present day. If you're into the likes of Led Zeppelin, Deep Purple, Pink Floyd, The Beatles, Queen, AC/DC, Muse and many others, then this is for you. Crow Dawn are Tim Mitchell, Rob Hensley, Steve Gill and Mike Pinn.

Saturday from 2:00–2:30pm: *Peter Krijgsman and John Hartoch* Peter Krijgsman has a style all his own, as a guitarist and songwriter. If you like Shel Silverstein, Hank Wangford, Bob Dylan and Leonard Cohen, you will certainly like Peter Krijgsman. He is accompanied by John Hartoch, who is also an accomplished guitarist. Their musical styles include Country, Ragtime and Blues.





Saturday from 2:40–3:10pm: *Caddick and Parkes* combine the dexterous skills of pianist Paul Caddick with the vocal talent of singer Nicky Parkes. They perform a range of songs spanning over 75 years of popular music, so there's a truly vintage vibe in store here. The duo are sure to provide fun and soulful musical entertainment on Saturday afternoon.

Saturday from 3:20–3:50pm: *Nine Pound Catfish* are Graham Butterfield and Ian Gardner on guitars, mandolin, banjo and vocals with Jane Gardner singing and playing washboard and percussion. Relatively new, having started in September 2015, they are all experienced musicians having each played in previous outfits. They play a mixture of hokum, ragtime blues and old country music, mainly from the twenties and thirties.





Saturday from 4:00–4:30pm: *Jim Watts* is a guitarist/singer from the village of Chulmleigh in Devon and specialises in blues, folk and country. He cites many influences including Duster Bennett, Eric Clapton, Bob Dylan, Johnny Cash, Tom Paxton, Derroll Adams, Howlin' Wolf, Van Morrison, Ry Cooder, Jimi Hendrix and B.B. King.

Saturday from 4:40–5:10pm: *The Rosie Eade Band* is a 4-piece outfit. Likened to the voices of Kate Bush, Maddy Prior and Grace Slick, yet inspired by The Who as much as Steeleye Span, Rosie is equally accomplished within the acoustic-folk and old school rock genres. She leads the band in both lively and evocative songs; life inspired stories written over a number of years gigging solo.

Saturday from 5:20–5:50pm: *JaCoB* consists of Pete Stearn and Mike Curtis (Just a Couple of Blokes). Pete is a well established singer and performer in the music clubs of Somerset and Avon and covers most genres. Mike Curtis has been playing lead guitar with Pete for a good while, and his exceptional guitar skills complement Pete's distinctive vocal style. They often play Magelake on our monthly music nights.





Saturday from 6:00–6:30pm: *The Silver Street Band* is a 4-piece consisting of Andrew Garbutt on bass guitar, Bev Blackmore on guitar and vocals, Tony Batten on guitar and vocals and Giles Newman Turner on harmonica and vocals. They'll be completing the afternoon of music organised by the Culm Valley Music and Performance Club.

Saturday from 7:00–8:00pm: *Byzantium Lane* is a soul, pop, country, rock 'n' roll and jazz band consisting of vocals, guitar, bass and drums. Their EP *About Time* is out NOW on iTunes and Amazon. Members are: Rebecca Reed, singer/songwriter; David Kerslake, guitarist; Dean Marcus Young, cajon player. The bands home town is Tiverton.





Saturday from 8:30–9:30pm: *Vivid Vague* are a four-piece band from Ottery St Mary formed in the winter of 2014. Fronted by the vocals of Michelle Dilling, guitars from Nathan Gregory, Adam Nickels on bass and Simon Hodgkiss on drums. Influences include the likes of Daughter and London Grammar to name a couple. Their sound has been likened to Siouxsie and the Banshees.

Saturday from 10:00–12:00am: *Diamondogz* pay homage to the fantastic and often over-the-top 70's Glam Rock era. From David Bowie to Mud and from Slade to the Bay City Rollers, Diamondogz have been spreading glitter all over England since 1993. Every performance is enlivened by some crazy costumes complete with stacked boots, wigs, glitter and the obligatory 70's flares! A welcome return to them after a wonderful gig here in 2012.
